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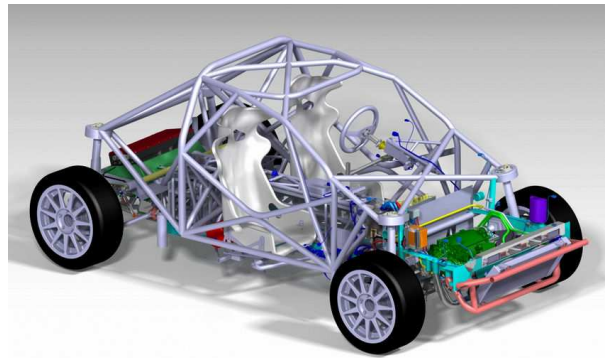
NWL Editorial

The current news in F1 is that Mercedes are close to breaking the 1000bhp figure for their 1.6 litre turbo engine. That is an amazing bit of technology progress, especially when you consider that the Bugatti Veyron, when it came out, had the same power but from an 8 litre quad turbo engine.

There was a big accident on the northbound M1 at the Hemel junction on Christmas day. Three hours of closure when three cars crashed, but without any injuries. If the recovery truck I saw leaving the area was anything to go by, someone had a very lucky escape, as the car was upside down and badly smashed up. Luckily I was going the other way.



The Formula E championship will now have the battery technology to get a car all the way to the finish of the race, rather than currently having to change cars half way through. It is interesting to see that the events in city centres are not connecting up to the local grid but running from sustainable energy generators.



VW are to re-enter the motorsport arena in a couple of years time when they expect to take part in the electric world rallycross series in 2020. There have been a couple of other cars developed that show the potential of these cars, especially as they are now on a par with the current 600bhp petrol engined ones.

The Mini is getting stripped down even further now and both subframes and all the suspension is now off the car. However, I'm now starting to find the dreaded rust, where seams have been welded up, but covered with sealant without being painted. Nothing major at the moment but just more work to be done. More lightening work to be carried out and then it will time to start putting it all back together again. Will have to start compiling a list of all the bits I'm going to need. The engine is still a bit of a concern, as I haven't got one yet, but I should get most of the bits for one

The Dakar this year will visit Peru, Bolivia and Argentina and will have 14 stages covering 5,000km of competitive motoring. This year there are 7 stages completely in the dunes. The event lasts for 15 days. There will be 142 bikes, 50 quads, 92 cars, 13 SxS and 44 trucks. The regulations for the event run to 159 pages!



No trip up to the Autosport show at the NEC this year as the MSA have decided not to run the live action autosolo this year. Maybe a trip over to the HRCR event at Gaydon instead.

December 2017 Update

Update from the Club Management Group

As the end of the year approaches, the Club Management Group thought it would be useful to provide an update regarding the progress being made against both the ongoing Member Communities initiatives and some of the topics raised at the Networking Meeting, back in June.

Apologies, it's quite a long read!

Event Notifications:

The new Event Notification system is currently being re-designed to ensure we meet the ever more stringent legislative requirements for Health and Safety, Data Protection, etc... However, you will be pleased to know we're also aiming to make the system more efficient and if possible enable event organisers to more easily amend their event submissions. We're hoping to be able to introduce the new system in early 2018.

Attendance Figures:

The recording and reporting of attendance figures will look very different in 2018 as we start to measure the 'moments of engagement' (i.e. the number of member attendances rather than the number of individual members who attend an event during a calendar year). Last year we had over 18,000 'attendances' or 'moments of engagement' as we will be referring to them. Next year we're aiming to increase this number significantly.

Communications:

It's been acknowledged that good communication is at the centre of improving the Member Communities. As such we will be continuing to produce regular Communiques and the Club Leadership and Member Communities team will be getting out even more to Groups activities in the coming year. We will also be continuing to run our Groups Networking Meetings with another 2 being organised for the 13th March in Sheffield and then 2 days later on the 15th March in Swindon. More details and specific invitations will be sent to each Group Secretary.

Recognising our Volunteer Community:

It's also been recognised that we need to potentially be doing more to recognise the fantastic contribution our volunteers make to Boundless.

The subject of the annual Honoraria payments was discussed by the Club Council at their November meeting and subsequently agreed to leave the current system in place with only minor tweaks. However, it was suggested that the volunteers on each Group Committee should also be recognised and as such the Club Leadership are looking at ways all volunteers can be celebrated.

We will of course continue with our annual Volunteer and Group of the Year Awards, whilst also looking in to alternative ways of celebrating successes. A key aspect of the forthcoming Networking Meetings will be how we better cherish our volunteer communities and encourage more members to step forward to join us.

It was great to see that the most overwhelmingly popular reasons members volunteer with Boundless, was because of the fun and friendship we all enjoy together. The recent volunteers survey showed an incredible increase in the levels of positivity being felt and is reflected in the strong advocacy we see when our members are out and about at events.

We're also now able to offer more training for volunteers, whether that's induction sessions for new committee members or training courses on specific issues such as Social Media usage. Of course, we always remember that you're volunteers – not employees!

Publicity:

Publicity is always a hot topic and this year it's been no different. We continue to work hard to raise the profile of the Member Communities both online via the website and emails, and also in the magazine. You'll hopefully have noticed the increased coverage we've enjoyed since July following the introduction of the new editorial team and in particular the individual features involving our Groups?

However, we can of course always do more. You will shortly notice the Member Communities presence on the website has changed to make it easier to navigate to our Groups events. This is a direct response to our Members noting the difficulties finding the Groups events on our website and we'd appreciate your feedback on the new website navigation.

We will also be scheduling in regular opportunities to promote the Member Communities in the whole Membership e-shots during 2018, plus a number of dedicated marketing activities at opportune moments during the year. The team in Brighton will of course be asking for details of those activities we can promote when these opportunities arise.

Data Protection:

Ever more stringent Data Protection legislation continues to be a headache for all organisations and Boundless is no different. With even stricter regulations being introduced in May 2018 (called GDPR), we've had to be very creative in ensuring we have compliant processes in place so we (and you) can continue to keep in touch with members in an appropriate manner, whilst also remaining within the legislation.

Events Equipment:

We have a great range of events equipment ranging from small marquees (X-gloos) to branded flags and banners for Groups to use at appropriate events. The new Events Equipment Handbook will be distributed in the next few weeks along with a more simplified booking system to allow Groups to borrow any additional equipment as and when they require for larger scale events they may be putting on or wishing to exhibit at.

Eligibility:

Eligibility has now been explained in a simple, concise and easily understandable format. All Groups were sent the Eligibility Leaflet after the June AGM, if you'd like to receive more copies of this, please let me know. We're also finalising a 'Keeping in Touch' process which will enable us to improve the information we hold of Members interests and also those held by individual Groups.

Local Groups:

Many Local Groups have struggled this year, seeing a drop off in attendances. However, others have seen increases. The Local Group Representatives on the Club Council have been tasked with addressing this issue to identify what works and what doesn't with regard to developing local activities. Obviously, we all live in a world that competes for our spare time and the Boundless Member Communities are needing to adapt to this changing environment. Those Groups who are seeing success, are clearly doing something right and it's important that we all have the opportunity to learn from their accomplishments.

Interest Groups:

Our Interest Groups, much like the Local Groups are seeing differing levels of success with regard to Member engagement. Once again, whilst some of our Groups report a very successful year with a good stream of new members attending and regulars returning, other Groups are seeing a more mixed picture.

New Brand:

The 'Boundless by CSMA' brand, launched in May 2016, is now firmly established within the Member Communities and it's been encouraging to see many Groups getting out and about and displaying all that's great about Boundless membership. However, we do still have plenty of work to do to ensure our Member Communities remain at the centre of this great organisation and continue to offer activities that our Members cherish.

The Club Management Group (CMG) are a sub-committee of the Club Council and are made up of the Club Leader, Heather Glanville, the Club Treasurer, Madeleine Grubb, the Deputy Club Leader, Pete Gregory and the Head of Member Communities, Nick Hoath. They meet regularly to progress the overall Member Communities strategy and day-to-day issues facing the Groups.

Groups Budgets

The Club Treasurer, Madeleine Grubb is delighted to be able to report that following the 28th November CSMA Board meeting, all Member Communities Groups Budgets were approved. As such Group Treasurers can now apply for any Imprest payments they require.

Madeleine would also like to remind all Group Treasurers to return their end of year QBAs as soon as possible to Accounts to allow for the end of year reconciliations to be completed. Group Treasurers should also note that the new 2018 QBA form has now been circulated.
