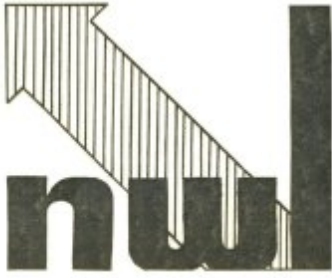

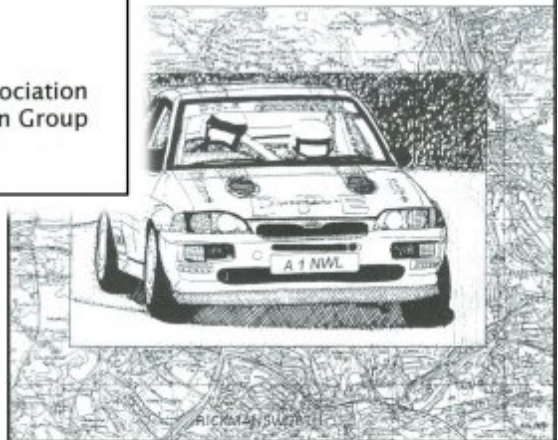

NWL Editorial

No new articles this month, but we do have another communique for your reading delight.

Good to see Elfyn Evans grab another win in Portugal and showing a very good turn of speed to keep ahead of Dani Sordo. The Hyundais still seem to have fragile rear suspensions, with both Thierry Neuville and Ott Tanak hitting banks and breaking the right rear links. Plenty of others suffered problems to restrict their attack but Elfyn kept it all under control and has now moved up to second place in the championship, just two points behind Ogier.



The grass autotests will be going ahead but we are going to be dependent of having some good weather to dry out the surface. We are having to use an alternative field this year and although we at least get to run some, we are now having to look for a new venue for next year, as all the ones we have used recently have either gone back into farming use or are about to.

The Monaco F1 race was as boring as usual, with the only overtaking being during the pit stops. Strange that Mercedes couldn't get the setup of Hamilton's car anywhere near that of Bottas, as it meant that with the wrong strategy of pit stop, he actually dropped places, when he could have made up a couple instead. As for the Bottas pit stop, that must have been very gaulling to be running so high, only for the wheel nut to be stripped and the mechanics being unable to remove the wheel! Toto Wolff even joked later on that they were still looking for a hacksaw to get the wheel off! At least they all started the event, unlike Charles Leclerc who put it in the barriers at the end of qualifying whilst on pole, but the team then gambled on the gearbox and rear end being ok, rather than take a five place grid penalty for changing the gearbox as a precaution. If they had, they could well have finished in fourth place and a very useful haul of points for the team. Nice to see that all the top three drivers where on their first visit to the Monaco podium.



Here is a nice bit of a coincidence for you from the WRC and F1 events at the weekend, as both winners were driving car 33!

Nice to see people out at the last chat and a drink and this time in the warm and dry Indoors. Numbers have dropped back to the usual level now that all the other pubs have reopened, meaning we now have the inside mostly to ourselves at one end. Why not come along and join us for the next one?

With the possibility of a return to the office late in June, the announcement of the option of flexible season tickets could be of benefit, as the option of smart working may be available, so that some days can still be worked from home. Working a four day week currently doesn't give me a saving between weekly and yearly season tickets, but the option to buy a bunch of discounted tickets to use as and when within the month could actually give a saving for a change. I will have to wait and see what they actually come up with!

Summer Grass Autotests Well we have a field to use, just not our usual one, as that has gone back into farming use due to the pony club moving out. The one we do have is only for the early events, as that is also going back into use, which means we are looking for another venue for either later this year but certainly for next year.

Greenacres Autotest The first event is the Greenacres Autotest run by NWL and Mike Harrison is the person in charge. Entries are via the TimingApp online system and payments are via BACs, with no paperwork being issued on the day, so get your entries in before the closing date of Tuesday 8th June. Entry fees are higher than the last time we ran, due to the increase in permit fees with the requirement for a Clubmans RS licence (as a minimum) for all events.

Grasshopper Autotest This will be run by NEL, with Mike Biss organising.

Paddock Autotest This will be run by NWL again, this time with Ian O'Connor running it.

Running Events With Covid safety requirements still in place, all organisers will need to be aware of the following things that need to be in place. **1.** A Covid Officer needs to be appointed for each event, who will have to complete a risk assessment form (available from MSUK) and return it to MSUK. This is in addition, and separate, to any stewards report forms. **2.** The government limit on the number of people allowed at an event is not applied if the event is running under a MSUK issued permit. **3.** All paperwork/results is to be electronic only, so no cheques/cash or paper entry forms, plus all competitors/marshals to print off their own paperwork for the event. None to be issued on the day. **4.** Self declaration of signing on and scrutineering is now done.

Member Communities Communique

May 2021 Update

Groups Update – UK Government’s lifting of restrictions

Following the UK Government announcement on May 10th, England will move to ‘Step 3’ of lifting the lockdown restrictions from Monday 17th May.

For our Group’s activities this will mean that activities outside will now be able to include up to a maximum of 30 people in number, although activities indoors will still be restricted to a maximum of 6, or two households. Scotland will be moving to ‘Level 2’ on the 17th May which has similar restrictions to England on indoor gatherings (6 people although from up to 3 households) however the limit on outdoor gatherings is currently restricted to 8 people.



All events will still be required to obtain the venue’s COVID safe statement or risk assessment, as a supplement to our own risk assessment procedures.

As always, Group committees should check with their fellow members that everyone is comfortable being involved in any activities prior to organising any events.

Update from 28th April Club Council Meeting

The Club Council met for their 76th meeting, once again via Zoom due to the ongoing Government restrictions and were joined for the meeting by the Association Chair, Heather Glanville.

The usual Interest Group Leaders and Local Groups Representatives reports were fairly brief due to the ongoing in-activity of many Groups, although as the roadmap out of the restrictions progresses, many Groups are now beginning to plan for future events with more certainty.

One of the key agenda items was the initial review of the Recognising Volunteers initiative being led by the Club Treasurer, Gerard O’Sullivan. This initiative is aimed at improving the use of the funds previously utilised within the honoraria scheme. The Club Council’s Expenses Sub-Committee have been working with Gerard to develop proposals that both recognise the great work our many volunteers undertake on behalf of Boundless, whilst also encouraging more members to step forward and volunteer. There is still some more work to be completed before the final proposals are brought to the June Club Council meeting and then these will be circulated to all Groups.

The other key agenda item was the review of the Independent Council Members project looking at the under-representation of women on the Club Council. This has sparked some interesting debate as to how the Club Council can encourage more members into its ranks. The Club Leadership will be taking this initiative forward, with the ICMs, as part of our working towards Investors in Volunteers accreditation.

Motoring Interest Group Committees can endorse as many nominees as they wish.

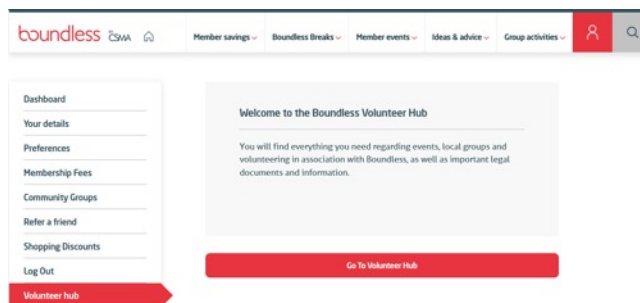

Single Event Notifications (SENs) and Risk Assessments

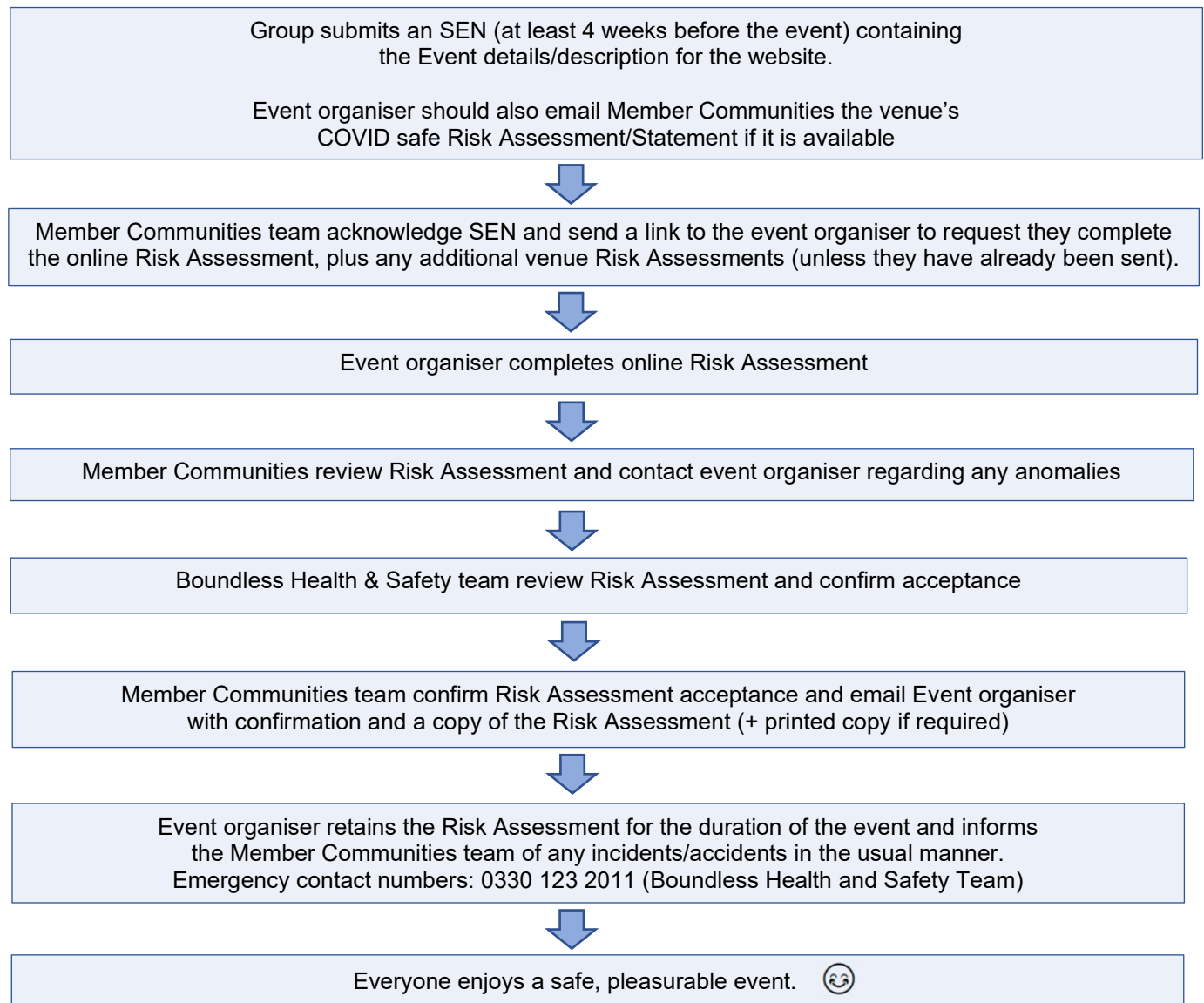
As Groups begin to return to their more traditional activities, it's time for Groups to submit their SENs and Risk Assessments.

As we're currently in a somewhat challenging period of time, that will likely continue for some time yet, we are now required to complete a slightly extended Risk Assessment for all events. As such we've been looking at a number of solutions that will satisfy both the corporate Health and Safety requirements, whilst also being considerate to our volunteer event organisers. As such we've recently invested in piece of software that will allow more flexibility for volunteers submitting an SEN and Risk Assessment (more details in a later communique). However, as with all new pieces of software – it's going to take a little while to install, therefore we have introduced an interim solution for all May and June events.

Below is a description of the process to be followed for the next few weeks.
