Don't forget we have Alan Smith returning for this months clubnight, to give a talk on the organisation of the London to Cape Town rally, which was held back in 2012. Several well known of our members were involved with the 29 day event, so should be an interesting evening.

Well, Elfyn Evans's hope of taking the fight to Rovanpera ended when he hit a barn and took a wheel off. The event used stages in Austria, Czech Republic and Germany over the three days and the conditions were wet and slippery, especially on the muddy cuts. As soon as Evans crashed out on Staurday on stage 14 (the last of the day), Rovanpera eased off and allowed Neuville into the lead and the win. With one round to go, in Japan, he will have to try and keep ahead of Neuville to make the runners up spot. It's a shame that he just can't get a really good season that is better than his team mate.



The 12 Car season will be starting in January, so please start planning for your entry now. Renewal of licences should be available on the MSUK website later in November.

The recent F1 races in North America, in the USA in Texas and then recently in Mexico, have not changed the top pecking order, but there has been a resurgence by Mercedes, although Hamilton got excluded for the floor being too worn. He wasn't the only one, but a combination of running a



new floor and then only have one practice session on a very bumpy track, didn't allow them to do enough testing to find the problem. In Mexico it was a different surface and they didn't have the same problems. In both races, Hamilton finished second, which is a big improvement on where they were, but there is still a big gap in the times to the winner. Still more work to do. McLaren seem to be on the rise, with both drivers putting in very good drives and Daniel Ricciardo in the Alpha Tauri getting a superb seventh, which might play nicely with him aiming

to get back in the Red Bull seat, especially now Perez is making a lot of mistakes. He crashed out at the first corner in Mexico, with a massive groan from the crowd as it happened.

I'm not sure why some drivers go out at night down country lanes, if every time a car comes the other way, they almost come to a stop. It would be better for them to go a longer way, using wider roads, rather than causing congestion for others. I know it is a problem with the brightness of the LED lights used these days, but if you know there is a problem, it is best to try and come up with an alternative, rather than plodding on with the same route and problems.

From the earliest days of motoring, 100 years ago, there has always been a challenge of who could drive from London to Cape Town and from Cape Town to London in the fastest time. In 2012, after several abortive attempts, the Endurance Rally Association ran an event from London to Cape Town which was open to any age or make of vehicle and any level of competitor experience. ### CSMA Centenary Year Retro Run 15th – 17th September 2023

This year the Retro Run returned to the Metropole Hotel in Llandrindod Wells in Wales, having been there in 2021 as part of Boundless by CSMA Centenary Celebrations.

Ann and I drove up on the Friday in the Audi towing the trailer, as we picked up the Sprite from Frontline on the way to Wales. The Sprite having had a gearbox rebuild to cure the oil leaks.

At Friday's reception and evening meals, we spent time catching up with old friends and enjoying a very nice meal, after which Malcolm and Madeleine gave us a good briefing of what to expect the next day.

I believe the event enjoyed a very near full entry of 28 cars and everyone started off from the car park at the back of the hotel, after a good hearty breakfast. Madeleine duly flagged us off from 10am onwards, after a group photograph. Duncan Wiles returned soon after in his Mini, as the exhaust had detached itself from the rear strap, just in front of the silencer box. Ann and I also returned to give Duncan a hand, but he had very nearly finished the job and only needed me to hold the box up so that he could do the bolts up.



So, setting off once more, Ann and I only manged 14.2 miles before I lost all drive on a very gentle uphill section, travelling at around 20mph, as we were looking out for one of the photographs at the back of the road book! Numerous people stopped to offer assistance, including Duncan, but there was nothing anybody could do, so I phoned Malcolm and he and Madeleine came out to take us back to the Metropole, where Malcolm and I then took the Audi and trailer back to the Sprite, loaded it up onto the trailer and deposited it back in the car park.



However, after a quick coffee, Ann and I headed off once more, taking a short cut route to Devils Bridge, for the lunchtime stop in the Audi (well, at least we could listen to the radio) and encountering quite a lot of mist, especially on the high sections. After a snack there, we started the second half of the run using the Tulip Road Book.

One fantastic place we did visit was Tretower Court and Castle, where you will find the fantastic remains of a medieval round tower and a medieval manor house, with fantastic first floor

rooms with huge oak rafters and beams on display. It's well worth a visit if you are ever in the area.

The Saturday evening meal included a planned fancy-dress competition, with the theme being the "Roaring Twenties". I have to say, some of the outfits were truly amazing and congratulations to the winners.

Sunday proved to be a grey day, with some early sun which unfortunately didn't last long. The morning route was only 62 miles compared to



Saturday's, which was very nearly double that at 110 miles. The first stop of the day was Brecon, which was charming, with some good coffee places to enjoy and a few shops.

I must mention that the Sunday also saw the introduction of the new 20mph speed limit in Wales, where everything that was previously 30mph, is now 20mph. Generally, this only affects towns and villages etc., the derestricted roads across the moors and mountains should hopefully remain unaffected, but only time will tell.

However, we soon found ourselves back at the Metropole with time to take part in another walking treasure hunt, with a set of questions based upon the heritage signs dotted around the centre of Llandrindod Wells, which proved very enjoyable, although it did start to rain again and quite heavy this time. The weekend concluded with an excellent cream tea at the Metropole and both Ann and I are looking forward to next year's event, although hopefully we will have better luck with the Sprite!
