The Hyundai he was driving went off the road at speed and hit a pole, causing his instant death. Fortunately, his co-driver was not hurt in the accident. The event went ahead at the express wish of his family and the Hyundai cars were all carrying a special Irish livery as a mark of respect. Elfyn Evans put in a sterling drive to take the win, but he was overcome at the finish by the tragedy and just couldn't take any delight in his first win in a while.



The last 12 Car rally of the season managed to get a decent number of entries in the end, but had to chase to get them. This is not just our events, it does seem that unless your event is going to be full very quickly, it just gets put off by competitors to a later time (or forgotten about), which is of no help to the organisers. Despite the atrocious conditions leading up to the event, thankfully it was quite nice for marshalling, you just had to watch out

for the water hiding the pot holes! John and Mick managed to get to their first control ok, but then had the misfortune to arrive at the wrong location for their second one. We couldn't work out where they actually were (a bit of misleading info) and so used to App to let all the competitors know it would be missing and what the next route card would be. This info arrived just in time for the first cars. It is this functionality that makes it a vital tool to us being able to run these events, especially with a shortage of marshals.

For the CSMA Centenary celebration meal, I was in Stratford upon Avon on the Friday morning for a Club Council meeting and then went for a walk in the afternoon along the river. Fortunately the weather forecast was wrong and we didn't get the bad rain and wind for Friday and Saturday, with the latter being a lovely mild day, which was great for the Shakespeare birthday parade. The hotel was very easy to get to coming in from the north, being about half a mile from the countryside. It was a superb do and it was nice to meet so many smart people! The walking treasure hunt on the Saturday morning was harder work than it should have been, as it was taking place at the same time as the parade, and most of the roads were shut to traffic and the pavements had barriers, so there was a lot of people around. However, it was set at a good level and all the clues were found, although the organisers got into a slight pickle when they changed a question but thought the old one was down a different road, off route, when it wasn't, so both answers appeared on the returned sheets. The hampers given out as prizes were very nice.



After the lunch, I made my way up to Stafford, ready for watching a MSUK autotest event the next day. At the lunch break of the autotest, I then headed off back towards Banbury, for a look at another motorsport event (at a new venue), before heading home. 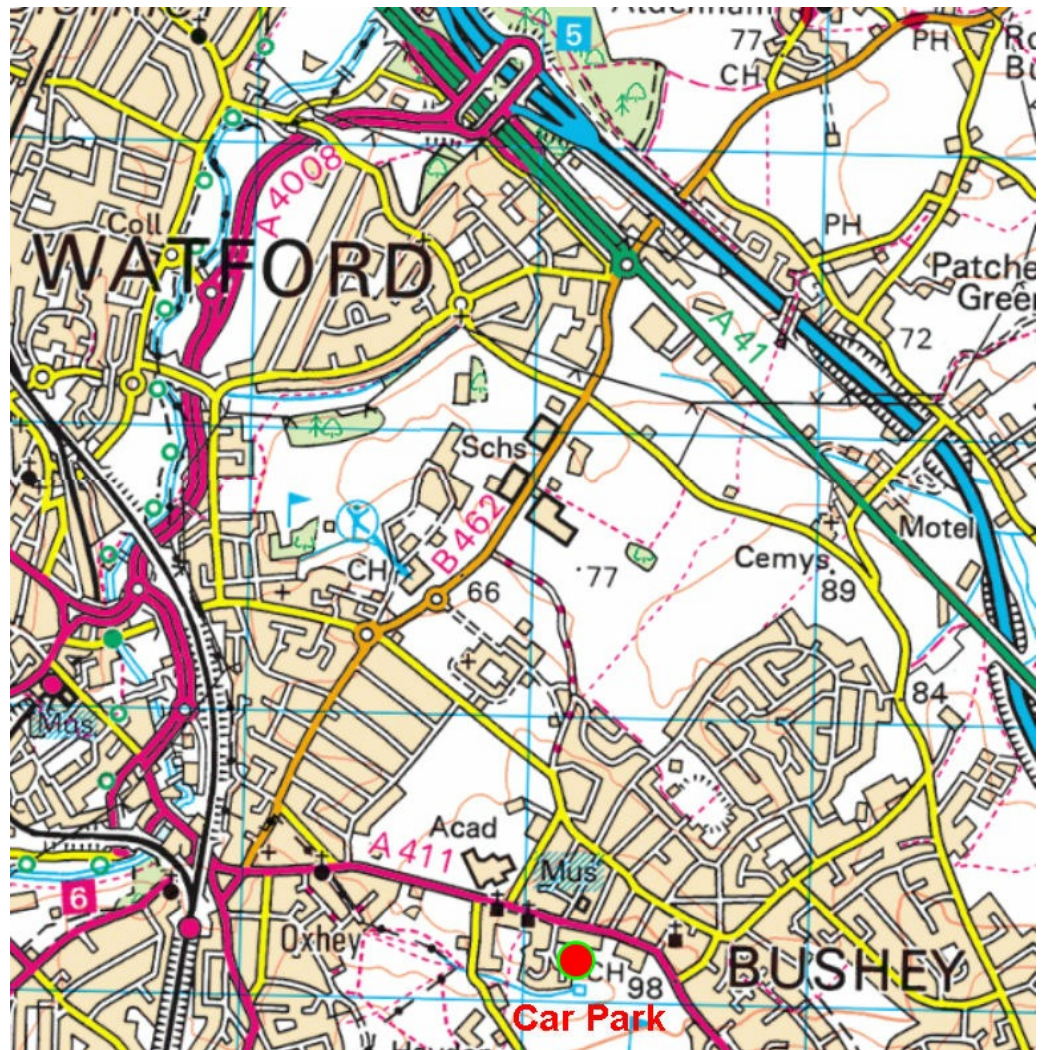
NWL May Clubnight - Walking Treasure Hunt

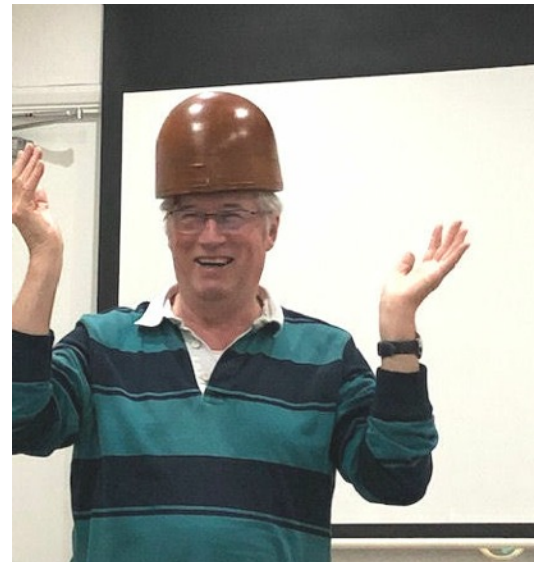




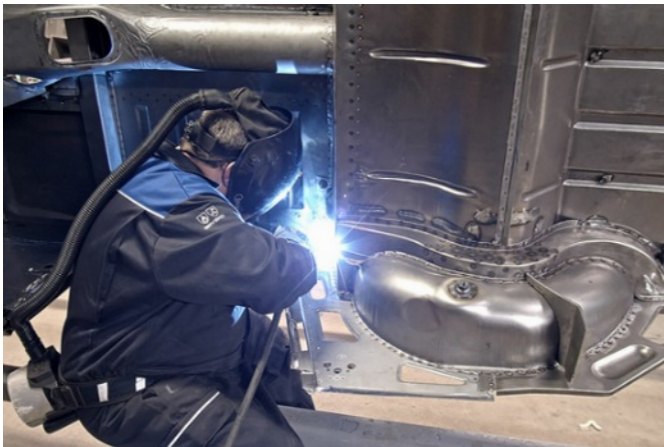

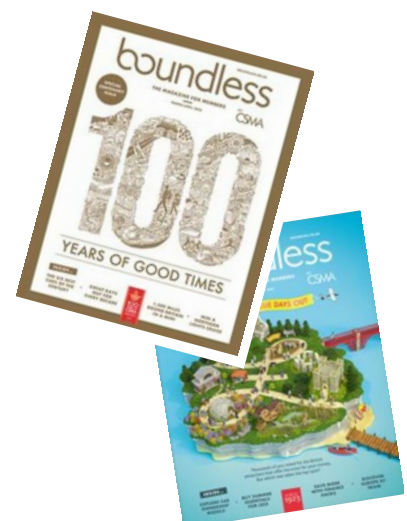
Nominations are open to any full member and are not restricted by any current Member Communities roles or positions held.

March 2023 Networking Meetings – Queries Raised!

Following the 2 Networking Meetings held in Edinburgh and Tunbridge Wells, several issues were raised and taken away for further consideration. A brief summary of the queries raised are listed below, along with the resultant actions taken/to be taken (in green text!):

Can we investigate a partnership with Royal Botanical Gardens in Edinburgh? This has been referred to the Boundless Business Development Manager to explore, who has established that as the Gardens are free to enter, a similar partnership as we have with Kew would not be viable at this stage.

Should we explore limiting members visits to key partners (i.e. Kew, WWT)? The Chief Operating Officer responded to note that existing contracts/agreements are currently in place with these partners and this idea may be considered when these contracts are renewed.

Is it possible to see an overall organogram for the whole organisation? This is included in this Communique.

Can Groups be informed of what data/member info they are allowed to hold? This is clarified in this communique.

What should a member do if they'd like to complaint about LV? LV have been in partnership with CSMA/Boundless for nearly all of our 100 years of existence and work incredibly hard to deliver the best insurance policies for our members. If a member is dissatisfied with any aspect of their relationship with LV they should contact LV directly in the first instance. Should the member wish to extend this complaint then they are at liberty to contact Boundless Member Services who will be able to advise on the most appropriate course of action

Are Boundless contacting eligible organisations for direct recruitment? The Business Development Team are in active contact with organisations and are constantly developing new opportunities for recruitment via these direct contacts and we're beginning to see some good recruitment sources being developed.

Is there a template for Groups Newsletters? Yes there is a template for Groups to use, this is available from Member Communities, however, it is not compulsory for Groups to use this. Many Groups successfully use their own designs for Programme Cards or provide and regular email updates to help promote their events.

Is there any Emergency Procedures advice Groups should be issuing at their Club Nights? This is included in this Communique

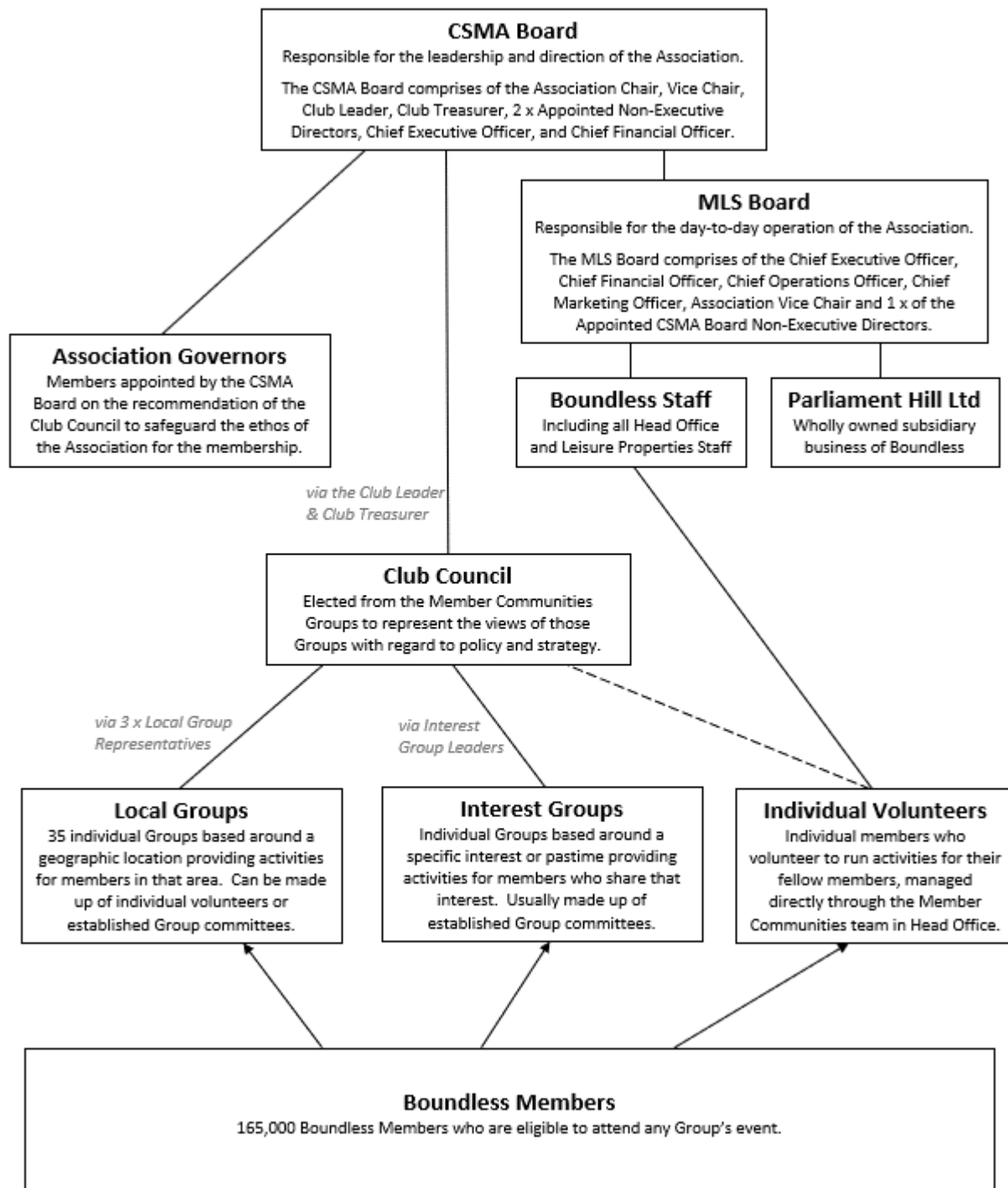
Do Group members receive an additional discount at our Leisure Properties? No, unless the Group are organising a specific group visit, at which point separate 'Group rate' negotiations would take place, otherwise all Members receive the same discount at our Leisure Properties.

Can the future Club Council dates be circulated to all Groups? These are included in this Communique.

Can Family/Joint/Motorsports Memberships be considered again? The Chief Operating Officer has set up an initial Zoom session on 27th April with identified individuals to discuss the issues around these specific types of memberships. More information/feedback will likely follow.

What Member data/information can Groups hold?

As requested at the Networking Meetings, below is a short explanation of what member data/information Groups are currently allowed to hold.

Groups can collect basic contact details (i.e. email addresses, phone numbers, etc.) if the individual has given the Group specific permission to do so. Note, this needs to be specific to the Group. This contact data should be held securely (password protected documents) by 1 or 2 agreed Committee Members and should be reviewed regularly, in addition to providing the opportunity for individuals to opt out of communications at any time. Obviously, Groups should limit communications to their contact databases to only those messages that are required for the efficient running of the Group.

The Data Protection Guidelines for Groups are currently being updated and will be circulated when completed.

Emergency Procedures at Groups Events

As raised at the Networking Meetings, we'd like to remind all Groups that Emergency Procedures should be issued at the beginning of any Club Night etc. These should include what actions to take in the event of a fire or emergency evacuation being required.

New Members 'Nurture Journey'

Another of the discussions at the Networking Meetings centred on whether new members (of which there were over 7,000 last year) are informed of their Local Group's activities. This includes providing them with details of all Local and Interest Groups, hence the importance of always having your group's events and activities listed on your webpage, as this will be the firstplace members are directed to, to find out more information about your group!

Updates to the Single Event Notice (SEN)

As part of making the SENs easier to monitor, we've changed the requirements for the 'Assessment Name'. We'd now prefer for volunteers submitting the SEN to entitle the 'Assessment' as follows:

Group Name – Event Name – Event Start Date.

For example; York – Day Trip to Museum – 12/03/2023.

This will make it easier for us to keep records of Groups submitting SENs and also support finding appropriate events for the Calendar Pages in the magazine. Thank you for your continuing efforts in helping to develop the SEN.

Change in Public Liability Insurance Requirements:

We're also delighted to be able to inform everyone planning an event and hence completing an SEN, that we no longer require the Public Liability Insurance renewal dates! The only requirements now, are that event organisers satisfy themselves that a venue has Public Liability Insurance for the time/date of their event.

If you discover that the venue will not have Public Liability Insurance on the date of your event, then note this in the appropriate questions on the SEN and the team will pick this up with you.



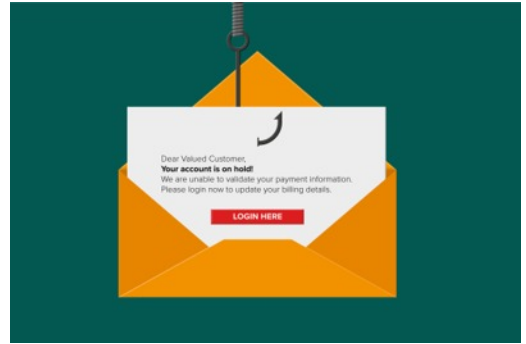
Email Scams
