Have you ever watched Secrets of the London Underground on ITV 4. Well, if you are adventurous, you can pay to join a tour. There are plenty of tours, all run by the London Transport Museum, with guides. I chose to tour Baker Street Station, which is part of the original Metropolitan Railway, the worlds' first underground railway. So, on the day I left home and made my way to meet outside Baker Street by the statue of Sherlock Holmes, as you do. After meeting our three guides from the Museum, followed by the usual bag and photo security checks, off we went. Like the programme, the guides have keys to the bits that are out bounds to the public. Before starting you are told to mind your head because some of the ceilings are low, do not touch anything, as it will be dusty, and do not touch any cables, as one of them said danger 415 volts. That would certainly fry something I thought. At various points we were given information. Why it was built because no railways were allowed to go south of the city road. How it was built, using the "cut and cover" method whereby they dug up the city road, laid the tracks at the bottom of the trench, and then covered it and re-laid the road, and in the process completely annoyed the road users. Back into another hidden bit, it turned out that we were below the original ticket hall. Out of that door, we crossed over the tracks, via a bridge and not walking on the rails. Stopping on the bridge, our guide pointed out two square holes, now covered in wood, but originally had glass. It was thought that this was so train spotters could stand there and get the engine numbers. Ever onward, we went down some stairs through a door to stand below platform one. The reasons why the station has gone through a change to its layout were explained. The lines to Watford, Chesham, Amersham, and Stanmore were causing a jam of passengers at Finchley Road and with the Baker Street and Waterloo line, now the Bakerloo line, terminating at Baker Street, this caused more jams at Baker Street. Hence the reason why Baker Street has finished up with ten platforms. The tour ended, after ninety minutes and many dusty corridors later, with a look at the where the London Underground rifle club was based. All in all, a very enjoyable visit, and you never know I might try one of other ones.

Well, that is all this month, but next month I shall hopefully be reporting on some museum visits. Keep smiling.

Please let me know if you would like to come, if you can give me a bit of notice that would be appreciated, so I can book everyone in.

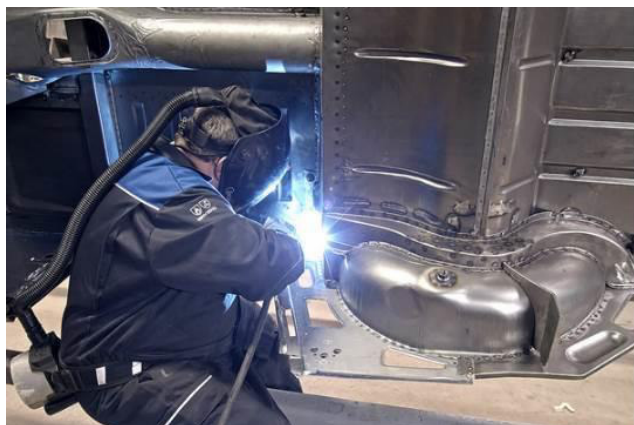

### Past Events

**April 12 Car Rally** There was a lot of water about (again) prior to the event, but thankfully less than the previous rally. Unfortunately, we only had six entries, so it was touch and go on whether it would run. The start pub was absolutely packed, when some unexpected parties turning up, so we had to share the alcove with a retirement party! Fortunately it had thinned out a bit by the time crews returned. Yet again competitors managed to sort themselves out to give us a result, making their own mistakes. Everyone made it back ok, and even the App newbie Dave Kirkham found its use a lot easier than expected.

### Future Events

**Future 12 Car Rally Season** We are changing the 12 Car Rally dates for next season, due to the January event being the most likely to be hit by bad weather, so the events will now run in Nov, Dec, Feb and Mar. The existing January event will move to Nov and the existing April event will move to Dec, with the existing February and March events staying as is. This also allows for the two uses of the John Bunyan PH start to be better separated. Slight problem on the December event, as Blackbird have moved their event forward a week (most likely to miss the Preston Rally weekend), so we may have to run ours on 29th November instead, but that is still four weeks from the previous event.

**Grass Autotest Season** Some good news, hopefully. We tentatively have the use of a new venue for our autotests, but unfortunately, we can't get on it until the grass has been cut for hay. This will take place early in July, so we have put in dates for three events, starting on Sunday 28th July. There may be a chance to use a different part of the field earlier in the year, but that option won't be available until next year. So, fingers crossed everything goes ok. Funny how these things come about, all thanks to John Clavey and a failed eBay sale!

**Alternative Grass Autotest Season** Blackbird AC are running a series of five grass autotests this year at their venue on the A5, just north of Towester. They are all on a Saturday, except the last one, where it is a double header weekend with a BBQ and camping available overnight.

**MSUK Clubman Licence** Almost all these events in the calendar require you to have one of these licences as a minimum to compete, either as a driver or passenger. If you go to <https://rsclubman.motorsportuk.org>, you can order your free licence, but please make sure you don't leave it to the last minute.

## Changes to the Boundless Magazine

Hence, we often end up filling the content with the same Groups (thanks - you know who you are!) who have provided us with suitable events with sufficient notice.

Considering this, the decision has been made to re-purpose the calendar pages to focus on content that has demonstrated higher engagement and resonance with our members. For example, the one-off Member Communities features which focussed on a particular Group or event, have consistently received positive feedback and higher page visits. Therefore, moving forward, you can expect to see more of these in-depth features, highlighting specific activities, such as the Aviation Group promotion in the spring issue and the focus on our Farnborough and Guildford Group in the upcoming summer issue. We also have an allocated page in the 'Days Out' intro section to utilise, which will be shared with the Britannia House led events.

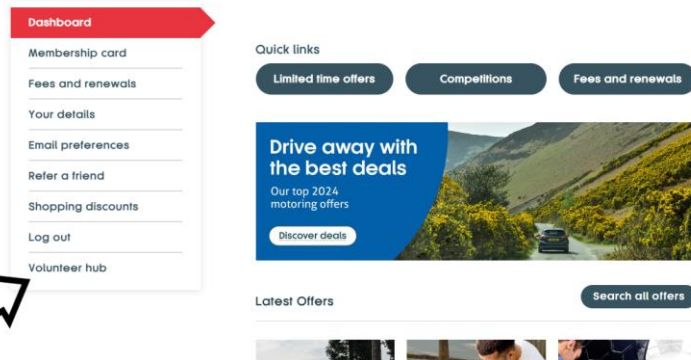


## Accessing the Volunteer Hub

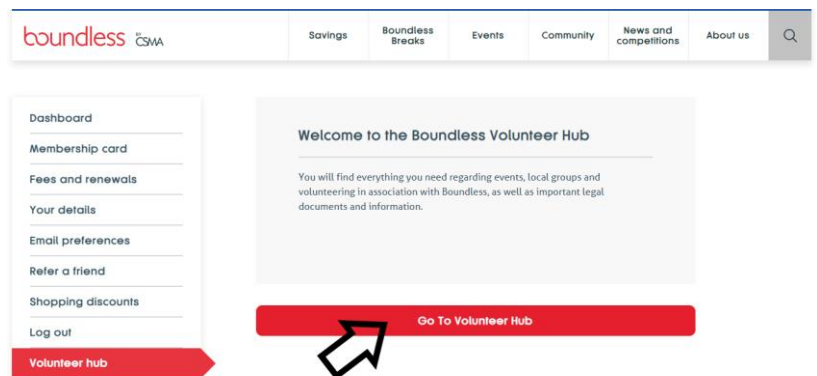
We've received a few queries recently regarding how volunteers access the Volunteer Hub.

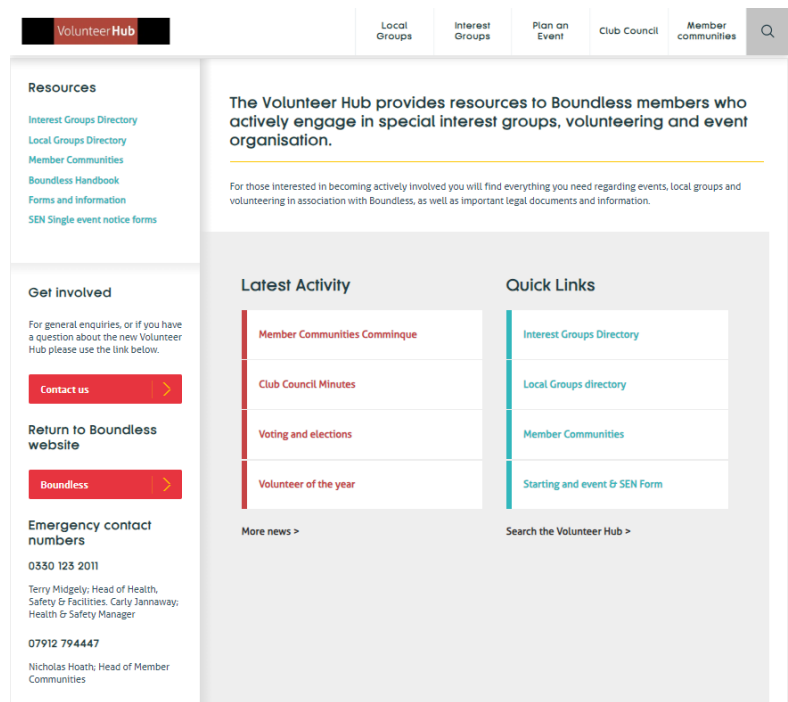


Click on the Volunteer Hub within the left-hand menu and the following screen will appear:

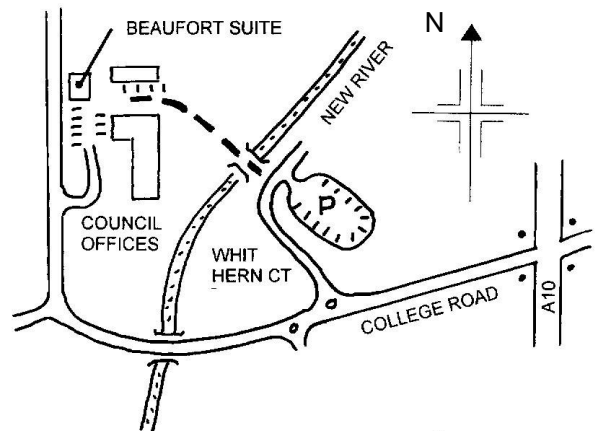
