July's birthday wishes go to Jan Yardley, Kit Yardley and Steve Graves!




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I was looking at the website Britain From Above https://www.britainfromabove.org.uk/ recently and thought I would see what they had for the Flitwick area. They unfortunately only had two photos, but this one is from 1931, and the yellow square highlights where my house will be built 44 years later. The houses at the top are still there, but the timber yard has gone. Looking at the larger pictures, nearly all the fields in the photos have been replaced by housing, marking Flitwick down as very much becoming a commuter town.



At the beginning of the month, I went and volunteered to marshal on the MSUK autotest as part of the Coventry Motofest. I remembered to take my ear plugs this time, as running underneath the inner ring road, it gets very loud when the cars are on test! It was a nice day in the 'shade' doing



timekeeper duties, using the timing App, and we got through all the tests in a very quick time. So far this year, Willie Keening in a sports car has usually started off in the lead on most rounds, only to start hitting cones trying just that little bit too hard, and has slipped back into second place



behind usual winner Alastair Moffatt. Of the five rounds held so far, he has managed to beat Alastair once, but it has been fun watching him try.

I wonder if Lewis Hamilton is having second thoughts about his move to Ferrari next year, as it seems Mercedes have finally got their car working now and are regularly beating the Ferrari's. However, it must be McLaren who are feeling very happy at the moment, as they seem to be on the same pace as Max Verstappen and Lando Norris came so close to catching Max again in Spain at the weekend. His run of good results has moved him up to second place in the championship.

On the WRC round at Rally Italia, it was a heart break for Sebastien Ogier, when on the very last stage, he got a puncture and lost the rally by just 0.2 seconds. Ott Tanak took the win, but he would know how Ogier felt, as he too has had the win taken away on the last stage of this event previously. Elfyn Evans finished in fourth, and despite dropping a place overall in the championship, he still took six points off the current leader.

On the way home from the Motorsports Group meeting, Pete and I were held up getting on to the M6 motorway at junction 2, due to a lorry carrying hay being on fire on the hard shoulder between the off and on ramps. All the west bound traffic was being taken off the motorway and made to use the roundabout at the junction, not helped by the phasing of the traffic lights. Traffic was stationary for two hours going that way, but fortunately we only had to negotiate the traffic on the roundabout, before going east bound and seeing the queue almost back to junction 1.




Chairman's notebook

On the nice sunny bank holiday Monday (for once) on the 27th May, Ann and I took the Sprite out to The Lamb PH at Chalgrove for a small charity classic car rally held in aid of the Oxford Air Ambulance, in memory of one of my scout leaders brother's son, who tragically died in a motor cycle accident in 2022.



It's a small run, which ran for the first time last year and this year's event included a short run from a nearby roadside café. About 30 vehicles took part and these ranged from bog standard Mini's to fully modified road legal drag racers and even an armoured car was included!







On Wednesday the 19th June, I organised for the new Aviation Group, a visit to the RAF Command Bunker at Uxbridge. We had a private tour for 20 of us, which was highly informative and took just under an hour, and afterwards we were free to walk around the museum, which is above ground, whereas the command room was 75 steps down below ground!

Given the bunker was constructed in 1938/1939, it's in remarkable good condition and I can highly recommend a visit there. The control room was responsible for the RAF's response to the Luftwaffe during Dunkirk, the battle of Britain, the Dieppe raid and of course D – Day on the 6th June 1944.

Last month, Ann and I have also paid a visit to Chatham Dockyard, which I have been meaning to do for a long time, having visited it back in the late 60's as a Sea Scout! Given the delays currently caused by the road works on the M25 at the A3 junction, I elected to go clockwise round the M25 and over the Dartford River Crossing, to get there on the Friday morning. I have to say the £2.50 toll was well worth the money, as we encountered no hold ups and arrived there 30 minutes early, for the 10am opening time of the museum!

I have to say, rather like Duxford, there is simply too much to see in one visit, however, your ticket is valid for 12 months from the date of issue and you can visit as many times as you want to between the two dates. However, it is not transferable and they take photographs of you to ensure you don't pass it on to someone else, although I could probably lend it to Doug!

If you don't like confined spaces, don't visit the submarine, the rope making building is just unbelievable given its length and the covered slip is just a forest of timbers as you can see from the photograph. The other photographs show the torpedo tubes and one of the two diesel engines in the submarine and a view across the dockyard from the preserved WW11 destroyer. I have to say it was a great day out.

Unfortunately, I had to cancel the planned visit to British Heritage Motor Museum at Whitney, due to a complete lack of interest; but we may perhaps try again next year.

The canal / river boat trip that Alan is organising has moved to the 14th September and numbers are good, although I suspect Alan would welcome more if you are interested.

Two Brewers Scatter Why not give this NWL event a go, for some treasure hunting action. The scoring is then done on you get more points for the location the less people who put in the same correct answer. This means the winner is not known until the last car comes in. The start is at the Verulamium Museum car park, St Albans from 7pm.

Grass Autotest Season Good news, we have the use of a new venue for our autotests, but unfortunately, we can't get on it until the grass has been cut for hay. This will take place early in July, so we have put in dates for three events, starting on Sunday 28th July. There may be a chance to use a different part of the field earlier in the year, but that option won't be available until next year. Regs are now available from the website.

Alternative Grass Autotest Season Blackbird AC are running a series of five grass autotests this year at their venue on the A5, just north of Towester. They are all on a Saturday, except the last one, where it is a double header weekend with a BBQ and camping available overnight.

12 Car Rally Season The 12 Car Rally dates for this season, due to the January event being the most likely to be hit by bad weather, the events will now run in Nov, Dec, Feb and Mar. The existing January event has moved to Nov and the existing April event to Dec, with the existing February and March events staying as is. This also allows for the two uses of the John Bunyan PH start to be better separated. The December event, as Blackbird have moved their event forward a week (most likely to miss the Preston Rally weekend), will now run on 29th November instead, but that is still four weeks from the previous event.

MSUK Clubman Licence Almost all these events in the calendar require you to have one of these licences as a minimum to compete, either as a driver or passenger. If you go to https://rsclubman.motorsportuk.org, you can order your free licence, but please make sure you don't leave it to the last minute.

Other Events Please see the calendar above for other events we have an invite to. I can get regs for any of these, just contact me if interested. Most of these events are entered via the Sapphire System, so regs, etc. can be found there. We will be invited to all the Anglian Motor Sport Club autosolos/autotests throughout the year.
