Well our second grass autotest went well, but entries were a bit low, with three people pulling out the day before due to illness. The ground hadn't seen any rain since our previous visit five weeks previously, so the ground was very dry. Thankfully it stood up well. I was using the Suzuki this time and I can report that the brakes now worked properly. I'm not sure on the reason for using hard competition pads in the rear (to make them work on autotests), as I would expect it to be standard ones would work better. I've got a standard set and will swap them over and see what they are like. It was interesting to note the difference in engine cooling to the Corsa. You can thrash the Suzuki around the test, come to a halt and the temperature gauge hasn't moved. The Corsa meanwhile, would go up the scale and bring in the fan and stay up that end most of the day. I think the Corsa will have to be retired now.

In F1, with another three races gone, the McLaren resurgence continues and after the second of these races, they were now leading the constructors championship and Lando Norris is eating away at Verstappen's lead, having taken 18 points more from these three events. However, he needs his team mate and some other teams to get between him and Verstappen to make the points needed

to overtake him.



On Saturday I went along to the Pistons & Props event at Sywell aerodrome in Northants, as Pete G had a spare passenger ticket, as he was displaying his Jaguar Mk2 on a stand. The weather forecast didn't look good, but it was good up until just after lunchtime.

There was a constant stream of bikes, karts and cars going out on the runway for a fast run and the commentator certainly knew their stuff. We had the wing walkers air display in the morning and there was going to be two more in the afternoon, culminating in the resident Spitfire and Mustang display. However, it was whilst walking around the dragster area, eating an ice cream, and



looking with a guizzical face at two Fiat 500's, one with a turbo charged Toyota engine in the back and the other with an American V8 in the front, with the driver sitting on the rear bench seat, that the first hints of rain started. We walked back to the Jaguar club display marquee, fortunately not too far



way, and got there just in time! It then started to rain heavily, then harder, then harder again. It eased up a bit, but then came back again just as bad, but this time the wind really got up. Then the hail arrived, big lumps about an inch across, but more in the shape of a lozenge than round. We were being hit with them, even when standing in the middle, as they were bouncing off the top of the one next door. Then there was a really big gust and the gazebo's around us broke and rolled over the parked cars, luckily without

damage. When the rain stopped after about a half hour, most people decided to leave. There was a lot of damaged stalls on the way out.

Remember that the first 12 Car rally will be on the 1st November this season, so make a note in your diaries and start making preparations for crews, etc.

Hopefully we will see you at clubnight for some buzzer quiz fun, being provided by our Chairman.
