Do you remember in mid October the slightly wrong BBC weather app forecasts, which somehow had wind speeds of 15,237mph in Flitwick and temperatures of 404C in Nottingham! I know we have climate change in the news, but this was a bit silly in the extreme.

The WRC has now come down to a fight between the Hyundai duo of Neuville and Tanak on the last event in Japan. Neuville still has the advantage, with a 25 point lead, but that could all change if the weather conditions are tricky. The hopes of Ogier taking another championship ended with him crashing on the last stage on the previous event. The calendar for 2025 has been expanded to 14 events, one up on this year, and features a visit to the Canary Islands, making the step up from the European championship, so be prepared for fog up in the hills.

After driving the Suzuki a bit more, I'm coming to the conclusion that it doesn't quite match what I'm looking for from a car to do the events I want to do. I can't see a way of changing anything on the car that would help here, so I may be putting it back on the market and looking for something else, but not sure what it is yet! My first thought has now been proven to not be the answer.

Meanwhile in F1, the Norris progress in taking the championship race to Verstappen seems to have stalled and it will need others to play a part in helping him get anywhere near the Red Bull driver. However, having just watched the Mexican GP, it seems Max is happy to sabotage his own

challenge, by reverting to his previous bad driving mode and not only got a 10 second penalty for an offence, he got another one for the same offence later on the same lap! It has got so bad that Red Bull have now fallen behind Ferrari in the Constructors table, down to third. With Perez not performing well, as usual, and although he has a contract for next year, the talk is that he may not be in the seat by the end of next year, or even at the start of the season. It might also be a case that Max gets

disheartened with F1 and decides to leave the sport at the end of the year, which is something he has said he might do, if he isn't enjoying it any more.

When councils put up signs advising drivers of a future road closure or road works, they must go into "we have advised you" mode, but totally ignoring the fact that this wording is so small when driving past it, as to make it useless. The only way you have a chance of reading it, is to come to a stop, which could easily be a chance of causing an accident on a straight bit of road, as the cars behind won't know what you are doing!

The recent Buzzer Quiz for the October clubnight was to the usual format and also as usual, our Chairman Mike managed

to come up with surprising answers to well known questions, i.e. he was wrong, but as question master, he was right! But it was fun....

Remember that the first 12 Car rally of the season is this Friday and it is a shame we only have six entries. But at least the weather looks ok, for this time of the year.

Also, we go down to Exmoor every June to celebrate our wedding Anniversary



and we have driven over most of the roads used anyway, so it was nice to try them in a different car!

We had a very nice drinks reception and dinner on the Friday night and come Saturday morning, after a very good full English breakfast, at approximately 10am, some twenty cars were waved off

by Madeleine and Malcolm, in no particular order or time out, towards the seaside town of Minehead, via Washford and the lovely village of Dunster. Most of us stopped in Dunster for lunch and some even took time to visit the castle. Dunster really is a very pretty village and well worth a visit if you haven't been before.

Once through Minehead, we headed off down the coast to Porlock Weir, where Ann and I took the opportunity to have a very nice Devon ice-cream and enjoy the sea views. After a brief stop, we then headed off up the Toll road, which avoids Porlock Hill, although to be honest it's not really very much easier than Por-

At the top of the toll road, we turned left and headed back towards Porlock Hill, but then turned right heading away from the coast into the Exmoor National Park, travelling through Exford and several other beautiful villages, using some lovely roads across the moors, before finally arriving back at the hotel around about 3pm, for a well-earned rest before the group dinner later that night.

That evening we enjoyed another good meal, with a fancy dress competition and quiz afterwards.



The next morning, after another excellent breakfast, we once again headed off towards the coast, but this time avoiding Minehead. Using some great roads, we travelled further Westwards across the moors, through Simonsbath and ending up at Lynmouth, where Ann and I stopped for a rest and a ride up to Lynton via the famous Cliff Railway, where at the top we enjoyed the views out across the sea towards the famous Countisbury Hill over a nice coffee at the cafe, which is located at the top of the railway.



After this short break, we then took the road

out of Lynmouth up through Lynton to the Valley of Rocks, which is very scenic before heading out further along the coast to the Lynton and Lynmouth preserved narrow gauge steam railway, which

is located at Woody Bay. Here they were running a Steam Gala Day, so we stopped and enjoyed the short ride up and down the track behind a narrow gauge locomotive on loan from the famous Ffestiniog railway. At the station, we also enjoyed coffee and cake, whilst taking in the garden railway and a mini traction engine giving rides to children and adults (larger children) and looked around the display of classic cars.

Having enjoyed the steam railway, we then headed out once more towards Combe Martin and Parracombe, before travelling through Brayford and Hamslade Cross and finally arriving once more at the hotel in time for our cream tea, which sadly signalled the end of the very enjoyable weekend.
