The Crazy Golf clubnight saw the 12 of us the only ones on the course, which seems normal for a mid-week evening. Portugal wasn't a particularly good event for Elfyn Evans in the latest WRC event. Having opened the road on the first day, sweeping the gravel, he couldn't keep in contention to get a good road position the next day and languished back in sixth place by the finish. His lead has now been cut from 43 points to 30 points, but will still be opening the road again on the next gravel event.

The alternative that the competitors want, is to make some areas where overtaking can be introduced, by altering the track and they say it could be done by reclaiming some land from the sea, like they have done for house building. It looks like we won't have any grass autotests this year, as the farmer has said no for this year. Most likely not enough rain since we last used it and it hasn't grown as quickly as it should have, so trying to save what he has. Totally understand his situation, as we are only using it for fun.

Don't forget about the walking Treasure Hunt for the June clubnight, which hopefully we will have a warmer evening, having moved back to its usual June date. Hope to see you in Abbots Langley.

You will have to change your log-in details and the whole ordering process is different. From an organisers point of view, they don't issue you with a licence that is easy to show in advance, it is more geared to showing it on your phone in person!

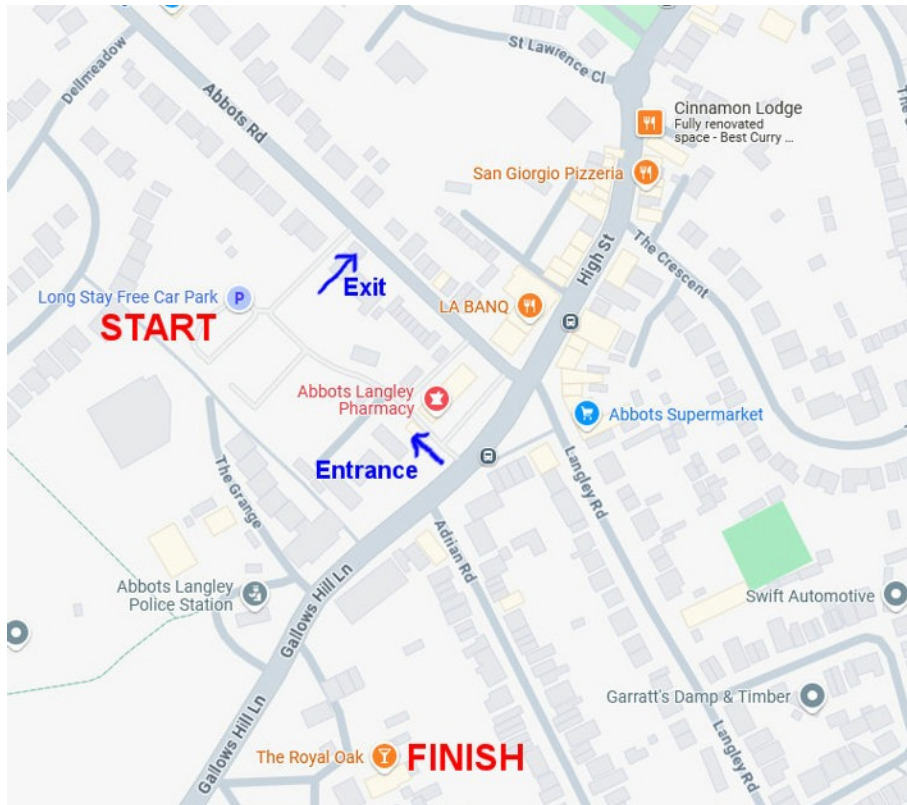

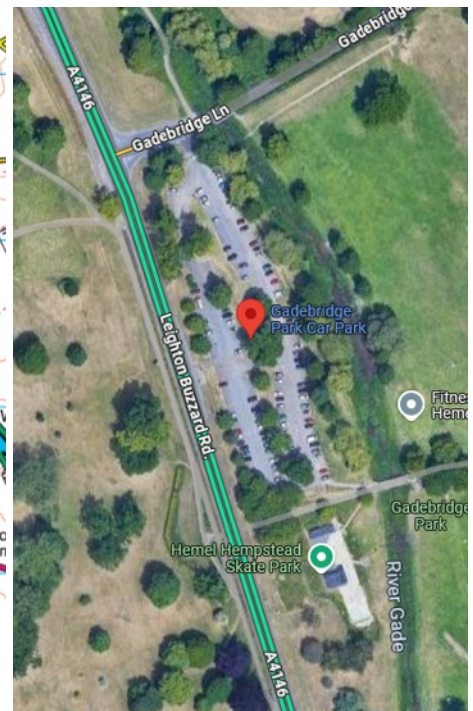
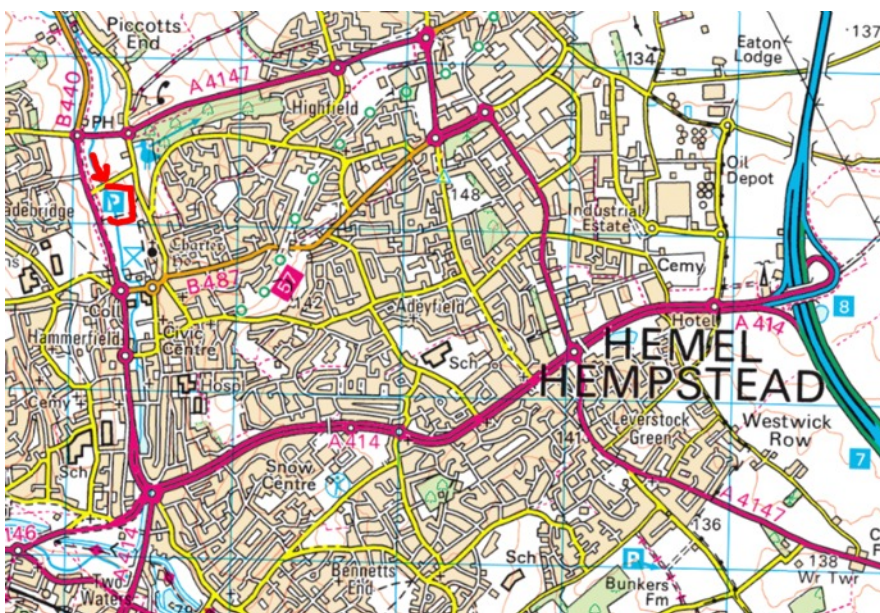
You are invited to the 42nd running of the Two Brewers Scatter. This year's event will be of a similar format to previous ones. You may need a torch to find clues if it gets too dark!
