I went up to the championship autotest at Coventry at the beginning of the month and although the MotoFest wasn't running this year, there was still a classic car gathering, as seen by the convoy of American police cars going past, with sirens and lights going of course! With ear plugs fitted, it was out on the course to marshal the first test and action got underway with a couple of wrong tests and several cones being hit. They got better during the day, until the person in the lead, got a wrong test on their last run. Fortunately for them, they had a big enough lead to keep the win. There were two entries from southern Ireland and three from Northern Ireland, but the latter arrived late due to their ferry crossing being cancelled and having to wait two hours for the next one. The three entries were in three cars, the Nova in the back of the van and the Mini saloon and Mini special in the trailer. It certainly makes it more economical on ferry fares.



The WRC sees Elfyn still in the lead of the championship, but his margin is getting smaller each event. He is going to have to try and manage his driving first on the road, to make sure he is still in contention come re-seeding on Saturday, something he has not managed as well as some of the other drivers. A rough event in Greece is next up and hopefully may give him a chance to get a good points haul.

Next clubnight is the Two Brewers scatter, which is a random route treasure hunt, where although there are 15 locations to visit, you only need to submit 8 answers, which means you can choose to either visit them all or not. Scores are determined on the number of people submitting answers for that location, so it usually comes down to when the last crew gets to the finish, that decides who is going to be the winner. So long as you get all of your 8 answers correct, anyone is in with a chance of winning the Two Brewers shield.

Over in F1, it does seem to look like Lando Norris has a pressure problem, as whenever he needs to provide a strong showing, he falls away or makes a big mistake, like he did in Canada, hitting his team mate in the closing laps. When out in front, he seems to be able to manage fine, but tries too hard when behind. Meanwhile his team mate Oscar Piastri, in only his third season in F1, has already won five races this year and is leading the championship by 22 points. With 10 of the 24 rounds gone, it looks like McLaren will at some point have to change who they are backing for the championship.

It is going to be a bit of a long shot, but does anyone have a copy of the 400th edition of the Big End Newsletter, from May 1992, which seems to be missing from the NWL archive? If you do, we would like to borrow it please, so that we can get it scanned.

If you go to <u>https://motorsportuk.sport80.com</u>, you can order your free licence, but please make sure you don't leave it to the last minute. The MSUK have introduced a new system for licence registration and it is still a work in progress, much to the users frustration. You will have to change your log-in details and the whole ordering process is different. From an organisers point of view, they don't issue you with a licence that is easy to show in advance, it is more geared to showing it on your phone in person!


You are invited to the 42nd running of the Two Brewers Scatter. This year's event will be of a similar format to previous ones. You may need a torch to find clues if it gets too dark!

The start will be 7:30pm onwards from the car park at Gadebridge Park Car Park, off Gadebridge Lane, Hemel Hempstead HP1 1LS - Map ref 051³/₄081³/₄. If you arrive after about 8:30pm, you'll probably find I've already moved to the finish venue (The Red Lion, Kings Langley) so find me there.

A copy of the relevant section of map will be provided, if required.

- Motorsport UK exemption certificate has been issued, 203738.
- The entry fee for the event is £5 per crew of two (but three OK).
- Crews will be entered in two classes:-Experts (won the event within the last 5 years) and Novices.
- There are 15 easy questions, but each crew are only required to answer a maximum of 8 questions.

Great Amwell

Please park by 10:00am in Amwell Lane in the vicinity of the War Memorial and the sign-post pointing to the Nature Reserve. If you park facing south (i.e. with the New River on your right), you will be ready to drive straight off to the second part of the Treasure Hunt. We will note what time you start at Great Amwell and what time you finish at Stanstead Abbotts, and will use overall time taken to determine the winners in the event of two teams being tied on number of correct answers. Please take particular care, as you will walk around the village as, for the most part, there are no pavements. At the end of this stage, we shall be looking to collect your answers, so that we can start marking, but if you cannot find us, do not worry.

Stanstead Abbotts

Drive down to the southern end of Amwell Lane and then left into High Street. Drive past some shops and then turn left into the public car park opposite "Abbotts Stoves". The charge is £1.50 – both cards and cash accepted.
