

**12 Car Rallies – Future Working** The revised class route, allowing people to choose how much they have to plot/plot on the move will be used for future events. It will be interesting to see what sort of response we get for the first event at the end of October. Regs for the first round should be available early in September. Another problem has arisen for us poor organisers, as the insurance available to crews on the night has gone through the roof, as the only other company providing cover, has pulled out of the market, as there have been some claims recently that have been very expensive. The rate on our last event was £23, it is now £65 (no, that isn't a misprint). Yearly cover for a competition car doesn't seem to have been affected, just the one off business. If you have a standard car, it might be worth going back to LV and paying the extra cost, to get the free rally cover.

**Grass Autotests** The season looks to be over for this year. If anyone knows of a venue, that doesn't get used for a grass cut, which most likely would be used by sheep, then please let me know. Another difficulty to getting a venue is a new Government idea of setting arable land aside for Wildlife/Nature areas, which could well reduce areas available!

**MSUK Clubman Licence** Almost all these events in the calendar require you to have one of these licences as a minimum to compete, either as a driver or passenger. If you go to <a href="https://motorsportuk.sport80.com">https://motorsportuk.sport80.com</a>, you can order your free licence, but please make sure you don't leave it to the last minute. The MSUK have introduced a new system for licence registration and it is still a work in progress, much to the users frustration. You will have to change your log-in details and the whole ordering process is different. From an organisers point of view, they don't issue you with a licence that is easy to show in advance, it is more geared to showing it on your phone in person!

**Other Events** Please see the calendar above for other events we have an invite to. I can get regs for any of these, just contact me if interested. Most of these events are entered via the Sapphire System, so regs, etc. can be found there. We will be invited to all the Anglian Motor Sport Club autosolos/autotests throughout the year.

#### 12 Car Rally - A guide to the new format

- Any standard car can be used. Event limited to only 12 cars. Around a 45 mile route, timed at an average speed of 30mph. Friday evening, starting at 20:30, with the start/finish at the same location at a pub, for a social before and after the event.
- Novice class now split into Semi-Expert and Novice classes. Expert/Semi-Expert/Novice class based on navigators experience only. Expert/Semi-Expert class have to work out the route from navigation issued at controls around the route. Novice class will have the route issued before the start, so they can plot the navigation before leaving the start (and get help if required). Semi-Expert/Novice class have a more straight forward navigation style.
- Beginners class now called RallyRun, for anyone to use marked maps for as long as they like, which allows people
  to just enjoy doing the event. You can do all the same things as the other classes, but don't have to work out the
  route.
- Penalties are incurred for missing loops and booking in early/late at time controls. Time recording and route checks
  are done using a Smart Phone and the Timing App, which give notice when approaching a control/check, so you
  know you are on the right route.

#### **Health & Safety**

As we head into our busiest season of events, please make sure you're completing any necessary health and safety requirements, especially SEN's and Risk Assessments.

Completing the Single Event Notice (SEN) and Risk Assessment process is a crucial step in the planning and delivery of events. It ensures Boundless by CSMA is informed of the event details, including the activities involved, from initial setup through to operation and dismantling.

The risk assessment identifies potential hazards, assesses the likelihood and impact of those risks, and outlines measures to mitigate or eliminate them. This process helps protect the safety of all involved and ensures compliance with Boundless by CSMA's legal and organisational health and safety responsibilities.

For Boundless by CSMA-organised events, volunteers are classed as employees and are covered under Boundless by CSMA's insurance if injured while performing their duties'.

Information submitted by volunteers during the planning stage also enables Boundless by CSMA to confirm that event activities fall within the scope of their insurance. Volunteers planning and running events will be covered under Boundless by CSMA's Public Liability Insurance. This protects against injury or damage to third parties, provided they are acting within their agreed roles and adhering to Boundless by CSMAs health and safety procedures.

Volunteers acting independently or outside the scope of their agreed responsibilities may not be covered. Therefore, clear communication and proper documentation between volunteers and the organisation is essential to ensure adequate insurance protection is in place at all times.

If you have any questions or require any help with completing your SEN or Risk Assessments, please do reach out to the team as they are on hand to help you.

#### **Incidents & Near Misses**

It's also important to report any incidents or near misses to the Member Communities Team so we can continue to keep both you, our volunteers and members safe. A reminder the emergency contact number for any urgent incidents is 0330 123 2011.








#### **Leeds Group Get Creative!**
