## NE London Group October Clubnight - "My World" by Stafford Steed

Most people who have a photographic interest take images of their own favoured subjects and I am no different, hence the title of the evening "My World".

On the evening I will show a selection of images I have taken in the format of Audio Visual. Although predominately travel, my photography is of a general nature, my website <a href="https://www.staffordsteed.co.uk">www.staffordsteed.co.uk</a> gives a broader snapshot of my work.

I started photography back in my school days but lacking patience in dark room processing moved into slide photography. I bought my first 35mm SLR camera in 1969, an East German Praktica Super TL. After building up a reasonable collection of slides I wondered what I could do with them and started projecting them to a music soundtrack. T his was before I had even of heard the term Audio Visual or belonged to a photographic society.

As time progressed, I came across, and purchased, a purposely packaged Audio visual system which comprised of 2 x 35mm slide projectors and specially designed cassette recorder. The package also included the electronic gismos to allow AV sequences to be prerecorded and, with the 2 projectors, enabled 2 projected images to dissolve into each other. After building up a collection of AV sequences I started to give presentations to friends and local societies.

I have been on the PAGB's approved list of lecturers since 1990 and since 2015 an approved lecturer to the Women's Institute. Since 1990 I have given over 350 presentations to Photographic Societies and other interested groups.

Around this time I started to travel to more interesting and adventurous destinations, some of these got added to my list of talks. Later that decade I was awarded LRPS (Licentiate of the Royal Photographic Society) and CPAGB (Credit from the Photo Alliance of Great Britain) both gained in Audio/Visual.

With the introduction of digital photography, the new century was a pivotal time for me; photographic societies became totally wrapped up in Photoshop, digital processing and no longer interested in 35mm slide presentations. Although I bought a digital camera it wasn't until some time later, when we took a trip to the North American Southern states, that my Audio Visual interest was reinvigorated. Well one couldn't put together a travel presentation visiting places like Nashville, Memphis and New Orleans without including the music.

During the evening I will try to demonstrate how audio visual has developed during the years I that have been involved; from the very first presentation I gave using a single projector, record deck, 6 watt amplifier with a pair of speakers housed in photocopy paper box cabinets; to the use of twin projectors; use of the spoken word necessitating multi track sound recording; through to the digital revolution and the more advance digital AV programs used today.

The Galley Hall is a country pub set in the Hertfordshire countryside to the North of Hoddesdon, it has its own car park, should this be full there is ample safe parking in the road outside.

The building dates back to 1374 when it was then a farmhouse known as "Collewelle Haw", but by 1765 its name had evolved to the "Galley Hall". The Galley Hall became a Beer House during the 1830's being kept by one Benjamin Logsdale. The deeds were conveyed to Christie and Cathrow Brewers of Hoddesdon in 1837. Bringing us up to date the Pub has been extended in character to provide an extra Function Room and Patio area providing comfortable dining etc

## COUNTRYSIDE WALK - 7th September 2025.

The Walk started from the Free Car Park, opposite The Fish & Eels at Dobbs Weir near Hoddesdon. There were 7 Walkers, including one who had driven from Southend and one from my Walking Group.

The first part of the walk was along the River Lea towards Enfield, then left on a footpath behind the houses of the road to Roydon. At the end of the houses we turned left and crossed the road to Roydon, which took us to the start of Glen Faba via a bridge across the Lea Navigation. Passing between 2 lakes, with the right hand one having many yachts, from Cheshunt Sailing Club, on it.



This was a sight not usually seen on our weekday walk. The full view of Glen Faba is at this point. I would say it is 1/2 mile wide and 3/4 mile in length, but only fully visible in a few places. Another left turn to start along the length, crossing a road leading to the back of a large house. Left again at the top and along the width, then left taking us slightly away from the water near a lock on the River Lea . As you continue down the length again, the front of the house seen earlier becomes visible until hidden again by an island in the lake. A right then left turn across the bridge again, then a footpath on the right takes you nearer to the River Lee and an open space and a gate next to the Fish & Eels Pub, crossing the road to the Free Car Park. Six of us then drove to The Galley Hall, eating in the Conservatory with a total of 39 people, for a very enjoyable meal.

My thanks to those who joined me, as this was going to be my last Group Walk.

We planned it to spend two nights in a hotel in Buxton, on the way up calling in on the Great British Car Journey at Ambergate, near to Matlock, which was an amazing place and had an array of British cars probably 60 in a warehouse alongside the River Derwent and some further cars outside that were available to drive around; if you paid them a lot of money, which we didn't. Inside, one of the cars was a rarity I'd never heard of before which is a Paramount, twelve of which were made in Swadlincote followed by fifty in Derby before they ran out of money. Out of all the cars there I identified ten models that I had owned at various times.





The next day was spent going back in time to the National Tramway Museum at Crich where I had been many many years ago with the Group but several new buildings had appeared since then and many more trams. We spent several happy hours riding the trams, looking round the sheds and the museum, and enjoying a guided tour from a very knowledgeable volunteer describing how it had all started and how the volunteers had got together many years ago to create such a wonderful collection. I then thought we could end the day with a visit to a preservation railway but we turned up at Wirksworth at the northern end of the Wirksworth to Derwent line to find we had just missed the last train

of the day so that's for another time, but a very nice chat to the ticket collector.

Then, the last day was when we took advantage of the voucher that my friend had got and we arrived at the Buxton pump house which is facing the wonderful Crescent and there were four classic sports cars lined up for us, all with the tops down because the day was nice and sunny if a little bit chilly. The organiser who owned these cars said that this was his last but one trip for the season so we were lucky to book our slot. He took off in his van after giving us a briefing of the cars and explained that the cars would keep in the same running order but the crews would move round.



We took some wonderful routes around Derbyshire and just into Staffordshire stopping three times at a farm, an old mill, and the pub overlooking Monsal Head, where we swapped around each time. First was the red MGA, then the blue MGB followed by the Morgan and a yellow TR6. We all therefore had a decent drive in all the cars and everyone felt that the Morgan was awful, much too bumpy certainly for those roads and they all loved best the MGB although the A had a single Weber carburettor, a 5 speed box and improved suspension which I particularly liked. So, three days of wonderful nostalgia.

#### 12 Car Rally - A guide to the new format

- Any standard car can be used. Event limited to only 12 cars. Around a 45 mile route, timed at an average speed of 30mph. Friday evening, starting at 20:30, with the start/finish at the same location at a pub, for a social before and after the event.
- Novice class now split into Semi-Expert and Novice classes. Expert/Semi-Expert/Novice class based on
  navigators experience only. Expert/Semi-Expert class have to work out the route from navigation issued at controls
  around the route. Novice class will have the route issued before the start, so they can plot the navigation before
  leaving the start (and get help if required). Semi-Expert/Novice class have a more straight forward navigation style.
- Beginners class now called RallyRun, for anyone to use marked maps for as long as they like, which allows people
  to just enjoy doing the event. You can do all the same things as the other classes, but don't have to work out the
  route.
- Penalties are incurred for missing loops and booking in early/late at time controls. Time recording and route checks
  are done using a Smart Phone and the Timing App, which give notice when approaching a control/check, so you
  know you are on the right route.
